On Easter Vigil, this most holy of nights, the family of God gathers and recalls the many and various ways that God has saved his people throughout the generations. The Old Testament stories tell over and over again about a God who challenges, loves, and cares for us. They naturally lead us to the place where we are saved – over and over again – in our baptism.

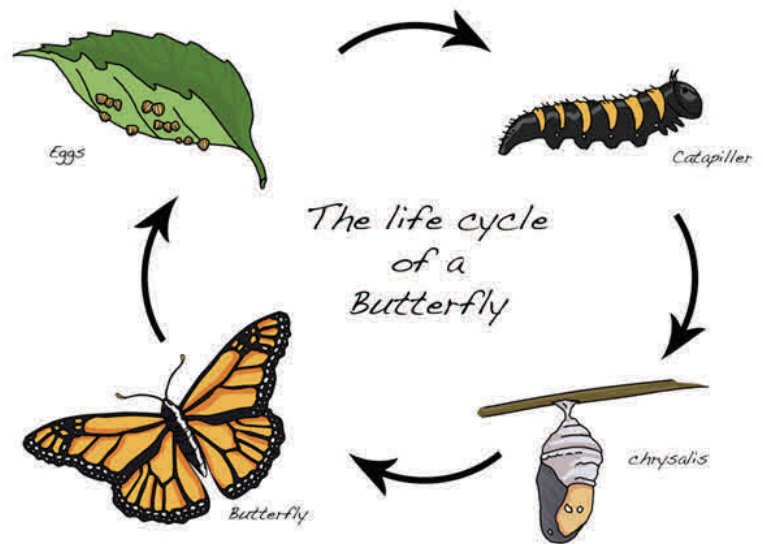
Liturgical Art

Have you been wondering about the larger than life cocoon on the wall behind the altar? One of the most beautiful symbols for Easter is the butterfly. Think about it. It starts off as a lowly earth-crawling caterpillar, attaches itself to a twig, spends time wrapped in a cocoon, where it “dies”, then emerges completely transformed, resurrected into new life.

Sounds a lot like the passion journey of Christ. We, as Christians, also take a Lenten journey of examination, repentance, and re-birth. As Luther reminds us, we die each day to sin and rise to new life in Christ through baptism.

The large cocoon can serve as a reminder to us of this miracle.

When its new life emerges at Easter Vigil, the butterfly will live in our sanctuary through the Easter season as a remarkable reminder of the victory that Jesus won for us over death when he was raised from the dead.

OUTREACH

The Addiction Crisis – A Catholic & Lutheran Response

Pastor Matt and Susan recently attended a six hour gathering to hear the spiritual nature of the addiction crisis and to discuss what are we, as churches and people of faith, are called to do about it. Bishop Dillahunt, from the ELCA Southern Ohio Synod, and Archbishop Schnurr, of the Cincinnati Archdiocese, were in attendance as a way of showing how important this issue is to both the ELCA and Catholic Churches.

It was explained that current science sees addiction as a disease and should be treated as such. Treating it just as a criminal matter doesn't work because people are still addicts when they come out of prison. As Christians, we are called to engage in a compassionate response.

“We all have a divine homesickness. We want to return to God, our creator, where we feel whole. If we can't get this from our lives or relationships, often people turn to addictive behavior (drugs, alcohol, food, gambling, shopping) to fill that void.”

The Church needs to play a pivotal role in helping people and their families reconnect to God and to lovingly help address those who are “prisoners to the cells of their body.”

Several Butler County organizations shared how they passionately make a practical difference in keeping people from becoming addicted or helping those already addicted receive the recovery they need.

Stay tuned for how CtK can and will join in the fight to help those who are addicted and are spiritually hungry.

MONARCH FEST

It started with a very hungry caterpillar and a withering milkweed plant. That scene from her garden inspired Donna to learn more about the dramatic habitat loss for monarch butterflies and to bring this information to the attention of Ctk's youth group. The kids jumped on board and were excited to make a difference in caring for God's creation, right here on Ctk's grounds.



Over the past 20 years, the monarch population has declined by 80%. This is due mainly to loss of habitat, namely the reduction of milkweed plants and other native pollinator plants.

Last fall, Ctk's youth group planted a prairie garden in the church's back yard and a pollinator garden at the end of the east parking lot. As these areas mature, they will be a haven for the monarch and other pollinators.

During the past few months, the youth and other Ctk members have been growing milkweed plants which will be handed out at a BIG community event which will highlight creating monarch habitats in local gardens...

- A formal prayer partner ministry will be started in order to nurture relationships for sharing our faith stories and supporting each other in prayer.
- There will be opportunities to identify the gifts which God has blessed each of us with and to explore the ways in which those gifts shape our stories.
- There will be a congregational "summer read" from an author who shares her against-all-odds story of becoming a person of faith.
- Summer Story telling will revolve around the people in the Bible who share our Spiritual Gifts and how their stories are similar to our own.

Getting to know ourselves (our stories) will help us understand our strengths and weaknesses as a congregation and will help us focus on who we are being called to be in our community.

PROPERTY

Project Updates

- Sanctuary Carpet—The carpet has been manufactured and should be installed within a couple weeks. It has been a long journey!
- Baptismal Font—The cover and floor surrounding the font’s pump pipe has been reconstructed. The cover was fabricated out of aluminum which should solve the corrosion problem.
- Kitchen Oven—The second kitchen oven will be replaced with a range/oven and a microwave. This necessitated modifying the cabinet and the counter top. The latter has been completed and the replacement of the cabinet is in progress. The range is rated for a 40 amp which required a new electrical feed. Because of a wide flange beam that is concealed in the east wall of the kitchen, a special electrical raceway system needs to be installed. This raceway system will be completed after the cabinet installation. The target is to have this completed by April 7.

WANTED: Help with our grounds

We need help in sprucing-up the grounds for major outdoor “Front Porch” events that will be happening this year.

People to help grow grass—There are several areas of our property with bare soil that, once the weather and soil conditions are right, will be in URGENT NEED of people to help do some grading, seeding, and strawing. This will help protect these areas against erosion and make sure the water goes where we need it to go.

People to help with yard clean-up—Clean-up work is needed around the church property, as well as, helping to move wood chips for mulch.

Both of these tasks need to happen as soon as possible. They can be done by yourself or in a party with others.
