In the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America we have not always lived up to our name. Being evangelical doesn't mean that we look down our noses at people who are non-believers or that we try to attain power by aligning ourselves with a political philosophy. Evangelical comes from the Greek word *evangelion* which means good message or good news. Evangelical means that we are called to be messengers of the good news.

So how do we share the good news? How can we change evangelical into the verb evangelize?

First, we need to understand what evangelism isn't. Evangelism isn't an HR program designed to bring more people to our congregation, so that we can be sure that it can continue. Evangelism isn't a way in which we can assure that our annual expenses can be covered because we have more people to put money in the offering plate.

Secondly, we need to understand that the two most important components of evangelism are relationship and invitation. While the pastor may be charismatic, the pastor is only one person and does not have the combined social reach of the congregation and can influence and invite a small number of people compared to the combined reach of the congregation.

Evangelism is getting to know people and inviting them into our story of how the Gospel has transformed our lives.

The invitation part is the trickiest. Getting the courage to invite someone to join us at a worship service is difficult to do. We worry about whether they will be annoyed with us or think that we are a Bible thumper.

Being gentle, being persistent, and not being afraid of failure allow us to share with others how our lives are changed by belonging to a group of people whose lives have been changed by grace and faith.

If you are not comfortable with the big invite to worship, there are other places where people can encounter Christians having fun and caring for one another. Think of all the non-worship activities we do here at Christ the King; The Block Party, Trunk or Treat, the Stepping Forward dinner, Lunch and Coffee With Pastor, Advent Brunch, Grapevine, Lutherans on the Loose, and more. All of these are ways that people can encounter us in a non-threatening manner and where they can ask questions and explore their doubt or just have fun.

This time of year with advent approaching we have some fun and different worship experiences for people to encounter; Praise and Pie the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, Wednesday evenings in Advent, Coffee House Christmas worship on the 22nd of December, and Christmas Eve .

The important thing is that we continue to invite and welcome and foster relationships so that the Gospel can be encountered in word and action.

Share the good news. Be Gospel in someone's life.

Lectionary Notes for November

As saints and souls—known and unknown—have been gathered into the heavenly harvest, we also celebrate the earth's harvest gathered into the barns. Whether we are urban, suburban, or rural dwellers, we gather this month in gratitude for our many blessings, share with one another from our bounty, and hear readings that declare Christ's presence with us now and in the fullness of time. Gradually, we inch toward Advent's new beginnings.

Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. In John 11:32-44, we join Mary and Martha as they grieve their brother Lazarus, whom a weeping Jesus raises from the dead. This week we remember our relationships and celebrate at the table with all the saints. Good funerals are followed with a good lunch, after all, and Isaiah promises just that: "The LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines . . . he will swallow up death forever" (Isa. 25:6-7).



VEIL (VIDA ETERNA IGLESIA LUTERANA)

VEIL is ...

**Vida Eterna Iglesia Luterana
(Eternal Life Lutheran Church),**
a local and Synodical ELCA Latino Ministry.

What is VEIL?

VEIL stands for Vida Eterna~Iglesia Luterana which translates to Eternal Life Lutheran Church. It was started in late 2010 as a mission church to the local Latino



community by the ELCA and the Southern Ohio Synod with Carmen Colón-Brown (long-time CtK member) as its pastor.

Members of VEIL come from many different countries which is unique for Latino churches. This inclusiveness speaks highly of the community. They have grown from a hesitant, small group which knew little of the Bible or God's grace to a cohesive group hungry for the Gospel, participating in all aspects of worship as lay participants, and open to Christian

education and baptism. Their youth are very active in ministry and learning.

Ninety-eight percent of VEIL members live below the poverty level. This church has inspired several of the youth to go to college, and in general, think of a better life for themselves.

The ELCA and Southern Ohio Synod fully supported this mission church for 5 years but has been decreasing funding by about 15% for each of the past two years, with the intention that it would be completely supported by neighboring ELCA congregations and grants in the coming years.
