

Community Harvest Garden Adopted Beds Guidelines

Community Harvest Garden

1. Keep your bed and adjoining paths well-tended.
2. Contact a garden leader if you will be unavailable to tend your garden bed for an extended period. If your bed appears to be untended for more than two weeks and you have not contacted a garden leader, you will be contacted, and your bed may be assigned to another gardener.
3. Plant tall plants and vining or trailing plants on trellises where they will not interfere with your neighbors' beds.
4. Do not enter another gardener's bed without permission.
5. At the end of the growing season, all dead plants and non-plant materials (twine, wire, wood, metal, plastic, etc.) must be removed and disposed of properly, and the garden bed left neat and tidy.
 - a. Plant material and twine can be placed in the compost pile.
 - b. Wood stakes can be stored for next year or placed in the woods to rot.
 - c. Metal and plastic can be thrown into a garbage can.
6. If any of the Adopted Bed Guidelines are violated, you will be contacted by a garden leader and will have one week to address the violation. After one week, if the violation has not been remedied, you may lose your gardening privileges.

As an Adopted Bed gardener, you have complete use of your own harvest; however, we encourage you to share a portion of your harvest with our neighborhood food pantry. Please let a garden leader know if you are willing to share produce.
